The City Council of the City of Nixon met in regular session on the 8th day of March, 2021 at 3:30 p.m. at the Aphne Pattillo Nixon Public Library located at 401 N. Nixon, Nixon, Texas 78140.

Madame Mayor called the meeting to order.

Quorum declared present and meeting called to order by Madame Mayor Dorothy Riojas.

Prayer given by. Mr. Rene Amaya.

Pledge of Allegiance to the United States of America and Texas recited.

A time limit of three (3) minutes shall be observed by all commenting citizens.

Mr. Adolf Trigo requested to address the City Council. Mr. Trigo is the current Nixon Area Chamber of Commerce President and wanted to introduce himself. He also wanted to express his desire to work together with the Nixon City Council as a community. He informed that all monthly meetings are held the 2nd Wednesday of each month at 6:15 p.m. Madame Mayor

requested the monthly meetings be posted on the library marquee. Librarian Sally Brassell agreed to do this task.

Rene Amaya made first motion, 2nd by Maggie Gaytan to approve the minutes for the 2/8/21 regular meeting and the 2/23/21 meeting. Vote called, 4/1 Mark Soto opposed as he was not present 2/8/21. Motion Passed.

Mark Soto made 1st motion, 2nd by Rene Amaya to approve the financial statements and unpaid bills for February 2021. All in Favor, 5/0, None opposed. Motion Passed.

City Employees in the Street, Park, Water and Sewer Departments were recognized by the Mayor, City Council members and City Administrator for their dedicated service throughout the year and especially the recent freeze and snow. Service Awards were issued to each Utility employee.

Police Chief Greg Huston, Mayor Dorothy Riojas, City Council and Administrator recognized the seven Nixon Police officers for their dedication to the community throughout the recent cold, snowy weather. Each was issued a Meritorious Citation signed by Chief Huston and Mayor Dorothy Riojas.

Assistant Fire Chief Jason Torres gave the Fire Department run report.

1ST Motion made by Justin La Fleur, 2nd by Mark Soto to approve amending the 2020-21 budget \$17,500 for the part-time code officer's salary and FICA. All in Favor 5/0, None Opposed. Motion Passed.

1ST Motion made by Maggie Gaytan 2nd by Justin LaFleur to approve the awarding of the Administration Services Contract for preparation of the City's 2021-2022 Texas Community Development Block Grant (TxCDBG) APPLICATION AND SUBSEQUENT ENGINEERING CONTRACT, if funded, to Langford. All in Favor 5 /0, None Opposed. Motion Passed

1st motion made by Justin LaFleur 2nd by Rene Amaya accepting awarding of the engineering service contract for the preparation of the City's 2021-2022 Texas Community Development Block Grant (TxCDBG) APPLICATION AND SUBSEQUENT ENGINEERING CONTRACT, if funded, to BEFCO. All in Favor 5/0, None Opposed. Motion Passed.

After much discussion, 1st Motion made by Justin La Fleur 2nd by Mark Soto to have Nixon utility customers pay the same amount as the previous months water bill, if their April water bill is extraordinarily high due to the bursted water pipes resulting in water spillage during the recent freeze. Billing is to be reviewed further by the City Administrator and Mayor. All in favor, 5/0. None opposed. Motion Passed

1st Motion made by Justin La Fleur 2nd by Mark Soto to increase NSF charges to \$45 from \$35. Vote taken, 4 to 1, Alderman Mary Ann Fatheree opposed. Motion Passed.

1st Motion made by Mark Soto 2nd by Maggie Gaytan to change North Rancho into a One-Way Street from E. 8th Street to N. Franklin Street while school is in session between the hours of

7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. N-S CISD and the City of Nixon will share the expense of signage. All in Favor 5/0, None Opposed. Motion Passed.

Agenda Item #11 regarding choice of tables for the New City Hall- TABLED until April 12th, 2021 meeting date.

Agenda Item # 12 regarding giving the City Manager the authority to purchase tables for the new city hall- TABLED until April 12th, 2021 meeting date.

Agenda Item # 13 regarding general rules and rental rates for the new City Hall- TABLED until April 12th, 2021 meeting date.

Police Chief Greg Huston gave the NPD monthly report. Chief Huston and Nixon Police Department presented a \$3,600 donation to Nixon Little League President T.J. Lopez This donation will allow for every Nixon little league player to have a baseball shirt this season. President Lopez accepted the check and showed everyone a picture of the jerseys to be worn.

1st Motion made by Mark Soto 2nd Maggie Gaytan to accept the sealed bid of \$4,000 given by Danny Regalado for the 1989 Ford F350 1-ton truck, VIN: 1FDKF38G7KNA97550. (two sealed bids were received, opened and read by City Administrator Harold D. Rice, witnessed by all persons present during today's open meeting.) Vote taken 4 to 1, Mary Ann Fatheree opposed, Motion Passed.

City Administrator Harold D. Rice gave his monthly report. He informed of the status of the New City Hall, Little League tentative start date, status of lighting installation at the Little League Field. He informed of the TX811 membership. TX811 is .95 per call and it sends a message to the City Administrator and Utility Foreman when someone is digging, The calling system will help in preventing lines being hit when customers are digging in the ground as the City will be able to go and locate the lines prior to the digging.

A RESOLUTION REGARDING A CONTRACT FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING A "**RESCUE TRUCK BED**"

WHEREAS, City of Nixon (the "Issuer") desires to enter into that certain Finance Contract by and between the Issuer and Government Capital Corporation ("GCC") for the purpose of financing a "Rescue Truck Bed". The Issuer desires to designate this Finance Contract as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" of the Issuer for the purposes of Section 265 (b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY CITY OF NIXON:

- Section 1.** That the Issuer will enter into a Finance Contract with GCC for the purpose of financing a "Rescue Truck Bed".
- Section 2.** That the Finance Contract by and between the City of Nixon and GCC is designated by the Issuer as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for the purposes of Section 265 (b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
- Section 3.** That the Issuer will designate the Mayor, or designee, as an authorized signer of the Finance Contract by and between the City of Nixon and GCC.
- Section 4.** That the City will use loan proceeds for reimbursement of expenditures related to the Property.

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-12-04A

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NIXON, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A TEXAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION TO THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, OFFICE OF RURAL AFFAIRS FOR THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FUND; AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND/OR THE CITY MANAGER TO ACT AS THE CITY'S EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE IN ALL MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE CITY'S PARTICIPATION IN THE TEXAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Nixon desires to develop a viable urban community, including decent housing and a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low-to-moderate income; and

WHEREAS, certain conditions exist which represent a threat to the public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and in the best interest of the City of Nixon to apply for funding under the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NIXON, TEXAS:

1. That a Texas Community Development Block Grant Program application for the Community Development Fund is hereby authorized to be filed on behalf of the City with the Texas Department of Agriculture.
2. That the City's application be placed in competition for funding under the Community Development Fund.
3. That the application be for **\$350,000.00 of grant funds** to carry out infrastructure improvements.
4. That the City Council directs and designates the following to act in all matters in connection with this application and the City's participation in the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program:
 - **The Mayor and/or City Manager** shall sever as the City's Chief Executive Officer and Authorized Representative to execute this application and any subsequent contractual documents;
 - **The Mayor, Mayor Pro-Tem, and City Manager** are authorized to execute environmental review documents between the Texas Department of Agriculture and the City; and
 - If this application is funded, **the Mayor, Mayor Pro-Tem, City Manager, City Secretary, and City Council Member(s)** are authorized to execute the Request for Payment Form documents and/or other forms required for requesting funds to reimburse project costs.

5. That all funds will be used in accordance with all applicable federal, state, local and programmatic requirements including but not limited to procurement, environmental review, labor standards, real property acquisition, and civil rights requirements.
6. **That it further be stated that the City of Nixon is committing \$35,000.00 from its Utility Fund as a cash contribution toward the activities of this infrastructure improvements project.**

In well #4 the depth from the water to the surface was 105.11 ft. The last time this well was checked was on March 3rd 2021. The level then was 104.80 ft. It is showing a 0.31 ft. loss in 4 weeks.

In well #5 the depth to water is 102.77 ft. The last time that this well was checked was on March 3rd 2021. The level at that time was at 102.72 ft. to the surface. It is showing a 0.05 ft. loss in 4 weeks.

In well #6 the depth to water is 97.18 ft. The last time this well was checked was on March 3rd 2021. The reading then was 99.6 ft. to water level from the surface. It is showing a gain of 2.42 ft. in 4 weeks.
